Eighth Day

Gospel: John 10:11-16

A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.

Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. THE CHAPLET OF THE FACE OF JESUS

(First to Ninth Day):

Using an ordinary rosary, with the crucifix, one prays or sings:

Open My Eyes (by Jesse Manibusan)

Using the succeeding beads, one prays: (1) Our Father, (3) Hail Mary's, (1) Glory Be.

1. Open My Eyes (Crucifix)
2. Our Father (First bead)
3. Hail Mary (3 Succeeding beads)
4. Glory Be (Fifth bead)
5. 50 Faces of Jesus according to the Gospel of the day (the 50 beads)
6. A verse of "Open My Eyes" (beads in between the decades)

To be used on the 1st, 5th and 9th days: The Chaplet of the Face of Jesus (meditating on the Faces of Jesus in the **Gospel of Luke**):

First Decade: Jesus was born and Tempted (After each face of Jesus, one answers: ***Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.***)

1. Jesus, whose birth was announced by the angel Gabriel to Mary.
2. Jesus, Son of the Most High, heir of David's throne.
3. Jesus, born in Bethlehem during the reign of Caesar Augustus.
4. Jesus, wrapped in swaddling cloth and laid in a manger.
5. Jesus, whose birth was announced to the shepherds.
6. Jesus, Simeon welcomed you and called you salvation of all people; light to the Gentiles and Glory of Israel.
7. Jesus, at the age of twelve – you were already busy with the Father's affairs.
8. Jesus, baptized by John, you are God's beloved Son; with you God is well pleased.
9. Jesus, son of Adam, son of God.
10. Jesus, you overcame the devil's temptation of possessions, power and prestige.

Second Decade: Jesus announces his Mission (Response: ***Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.***)

1. Jesus, anointed by the Spirit to bring glad tidings to the poor.
2. Jesus, with authority and power you drove away unclean spirits.
3. Jesus, you healed Peter's mother-in-law and cured all people with various diseases.
4. Jesus, you made Simon, James and John fishers of men; they left everything and followed you.

5. Jesus, Friend of the leper; Friend of the paralytic man; forgiver of sins.
6. Jesus, Friend of tax collectors and sinners – dining and wining with them.
7. Jesus, the bridegroom, the new wine, the Son of Man, the Lord of the Sabbath.
8. Jesus, you chose the Twelve and admonished them to "be merciful, just as your father is merciful".
9. Jesus, Friend of the centurion and of the widow of Nain – bringing back their children to life.
10. Jesus, Friend of the blind, the lame, the lepers, the deaf, the dead, and of the poor.

Third Decade: Jesus, the Anointed and the Rejected (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, Friend of the sinful woman who bathe your feet with tears and ointment.
2. Jesus, you proclaimed the good news of the kingdom of God accompanied by the Twelve and some women.
3. Jesus, the Sower, a brother to all who hear the Word of God and act on it.
4. Jesus, you rebuked the wind and the waves just as you rebuked the spirits tormenting the man from Gerasenes.
5. Jesus, Friend of Jairus, whose daughter you healed after healing the woman afflicted with hemorrhages.
6. Jesus, you sent the Twelve to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick.
7. Jesus, when the apostles returned from their mission you invited them to rest in a deserted place.
8. Jesus, you blessed, broke and shared bread and fish with the 5,000 hungry people – organized in small groups of 50's.

9. Jesus, you transfigured on a mountain top so that you can transfigure others down the plain to serve people.
10. Jesus, rejected in a Samaritan village, you proceeded to other villages to preach the Good News.

Fourth Decade: Jesus invites and sends friends and disciples
(Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, you called and sent 72 others who went in pairs to town and cities you intended to visit.
2. Jesus, the Good Samaritan and the Neighbor in need you tell us to “go and do likewise.”
3. Jesus, you taught your disciples to pray to “Our Father”.
4. Jesus, you want us to be clean inside and out.
5. Jesus, you told us to seek first the kingdom, and other things will be given besides.
6. Jesus, you want us to repent learning from the parable of the fig tree – giving it a chance to bear fruits.
7. Jesus, you set free the woman bent over for eighteen years from her infirmity.
8. Jesus, you dined with tax collectors and sinners; teaching them the parables of the lost sheep, lost coin and of the prodigal son.
9. Jesus, you preached that no servant can serve God and mammon; then you told the story of Dives and Lazarus.
10. Jesus, Friend of ten lepers, you appreciated the Samaritan one who came back to thank you.

Fifth Decade: Jesus, Friend of poor and sinners till death.
(Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, you said, the Kingdom belongs to the little ones and to anyone who sells what he has and distributes it to the poor.
2. Jesus, you opened the eyes of the blind man and you opened the heart of Zacchaeus who gave half of his possessions to the poor.
3. Jesus, you entered Jerusalem with people singing "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord".
4. Jesus, you appreciated a poor widow offering from her poverty.
5. Jesus, after breaking bread with your friends and disciples, you prayed at Gethsemane: "Father, not my will but your will be done".
6. Jesus, Judas gave you a kiss of betrayal; the others slept while you were agonizing; then Peter denied you three times.
7. Jesus, mocked by Herod, condemned to death on a cross by Pilate.
8. Jesus, you prayed "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do.
9. Jesus, you are not among the dead for you have been raised.
10. Jesus, you appeared to your friends and disciples leading them to Bethany, where you ascended to heaven.

To be used on 2nd and 6th days: The Chaplet of the Face of Jesus (meditating on the Faces of Jesus in the **Gospel of Mark**):

First Decade: Jesus, Son of God, leader of the Twelve Apostles.

(Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, God's beloved Son, in whom God is well pleased.
2. Jesus, driven by the Spirit in the desert, tempted by Satan.
3. Jesus, proclaiming the Good News and its fulfillment.
4. Jesus, leader of fishers of men and women.
5. Jesus of Nazareth, a healer and enabler as seen in the healing of Peter's mother-in-law.
6. Jesus, merciful to the sick and possessed; prayerful and lover of silent moments.
7. Jesus, preaching the gospel everywhere not for popularity.
8. Jesus, Friend of the tax collectors and sinners.
9. Jesus, the new wine; the Son of Man, Lord of the Sabbath.
10. Jesus, leader of the Twelve Apostles - saints and sinners.

Pray or sing:

Open my eyes, Lord.

Help me to see your face.

Second Decade: Jesus, ridiculed for hanging around with strange friends. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, thought to be "out of his mind"; thought to be "possessed by Beelzebub".
2. Jesus, Sower of the Word, a brother and a son to whoever does the will of God.
3. Jesus, healer of the man who had unclean spirit.
4. Jesus, healer of Jairus' daughter and of the woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years.
5. Jesus, carpenter, rejected by town mates, you sent the Twelve to drive demons out and to cure the sick.

6. Jesus, thought to be John, Elijah and one of the prophets; you mourned the death of John the Baptist.
7. Jesus, blessing, breaking and sharing bread and fish to feed the hungry in a Jewish territory.
8. Jesus, walking on the sea, overcoming forces of death and evil; calming winds and storms.
9. Jesus, visiting villages, towns and countryside to bring God's healing; dining with people who do not wash hands before eating.
10. Jesus, teaching against hypocrisy and lip service; a Friend of the Syrophoenician woman - a foreigner.

Third Decade: Jesus predicted his passion, death and resurrection three times. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, you blessed, broke and shared bread and fish to feed the hungry in a Gentile territory.
2. Jesus, misunderstood by his friends and disciples. You predicted, for the 1st time, your passion death and resurrection.
3. Jesus, rebuked by Peter, you transfigured before him, James and John.
4. Jesus, God's beloved Son to whom we must listen, you predicted, for the 2nd time, your passion death and resurrection.
5. Jesus, Salt of the earth, a Friend of the outsider driving out demons in your name.
6. Jesus, Friend of small little ones; a Friend of the rich young man challenged to sell all his property and follow you.
7. Jesus, Friend of the poor. You predicted, for the 3rd time, your passion death and resurrection.
8. Jesus, Friend of Bartimeus, the blind man of Jericho; you entered Jerusalem triumphantly.

9. Jesus, hungry, you cursed the fig tree for lack of fruits. Jesus, angry, you cleansed the temple for lack of fruits.
10. Jesus, Son of the owner of the vineyard; the stone rejected by the builder but became the cornerstone.

Fourth Decade: Jesus, totally abandoned by Friends and Disciples. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, a tax payer and God-lover; Scripture reader.
2. Jesus, admirer of the poor widow contributing all she had.
3. Jesus, Friend of Simon the leper; Friend of the woman who anointed your feet; your Gospel is told in memory of her.
4. Jesus, whose Passover meal was partaken under the shadow of betrayal of a friend - Judas.
5. Jesus, whose friends would be dispersed when you, the Shepherd, are struck.
6. Jesus, asking your friends and disciples to keep watch as you prayed to the Father to take away the cup from you.
7. Jesus, your friends and disciples slept over; you were kissed by Judas to hand you over.
8. Jesus, abandoned totally by your friends and disciples.
9. Jesus, accused falsely before the chief priests and the Sanhedrin.
10. Jesus, mocked and struck, greeted with blows.

Fifth decade: Jesus the Risen One, sending us to proclaim the Gospel to every creature. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, denied by Peter 3 times before the cock crowed twice.
2. Jesus, bound and led to Pilate; rejected by the crowd who set Barabbas free instead.
3. Jesus, condemned to die on a cross.
4. Jesus, helped by Simon of Cyrene to carry the cross.
5. Jesus, crucified between two criminals.
6. Jesus, reviled while dying on the cross.
7. Jesus, declared by the centurion to be truly the Son of God when he saw how he died.
8. Jesus, Friend of Joseph of Arimathea who buried you in an unused tomb.
9. Jesus, who appeared first to Mary Magdalene; then to others walking along on their way to the country sides.
10. Jesus, who appeared to the eleven and told them "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature".

To be used on 3rd and 7th days: The Chaplet of the Face of Jesus (meditating on the Faces of Jesus in the **Gospel of Matthew**):

First Decade: Jesus, Emmanuel, the Salt of the earth, Light of the world. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, the son of David, the son of Abraham.
2. Jesus, Emmanuel, an angel announced your birth to Joseph.
3. Jesus, magi from the east came to Bethlehem to worship you.
4. Jesus, from Egypt, your family dwelt in Nazareth.
5. Jesus, after baptism in the Jordan, you were tempted by the devil.
6. Jesus, the Great Light seen by "the people who sit in darkness."
7. Jesus, you called some fishermen to become fishers of men and women.
8. Jesus, you call the poor "blessed" for theirs is the kingdom of God.
9. Jesus, the Salt of the earth, the Light of the world, you call us to "be perfect, just as your heavenly father is perfect".
10. Jesus, you ask us to pray, give alms and fast in secret to glorify the father and not ourselves.

Second Decade: Jesus, the New Wine who gives new life. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, you tell us to stop judging that we may not be judged.
2. Jesus, you tell us to ask, seek, and knock as you taught us to bear good fruit.
3. Jesus, you are Friend of the sick, taking away our infirmities and bearing our diseases.
4. Jesus, you ask us to follow you without limit: "Follow me, and let the dead bury their dead."
5. Jesus, you calmed all the fears of your friends and disciples as you sailed with them in the stormy sea.

6. Jesus, Friend of the tax collector Matthew, you desire mercy, not sacrifice.
7. Jesus, the New Wine, you give new life, new health; new sight; new speech and new hearing.
8. Jesus, you pray for more laborers in the Lord's harvest.
9. Jesus, you sent the 12 disciples giving them authority over unclean spirits.
10. Jesus, you said: "whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me."

Third Decade: Jesus, you are the One who is to come. (Response: Open my eyes, Lord, help me to see your face.)

1. Jesus, you are the One who is to come – proclaiming the Good News to the poor.
2. Jesus, you invite us to come to you, "For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."
3. Jesus, you let your hungry friends and disciples to pick up heads of grain on a Sabbath.

both now and forever. Amen.

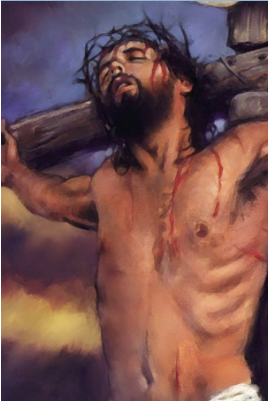
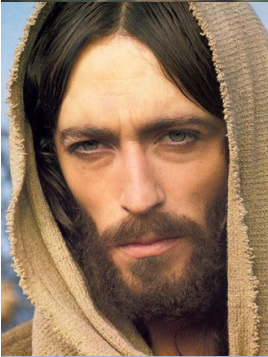
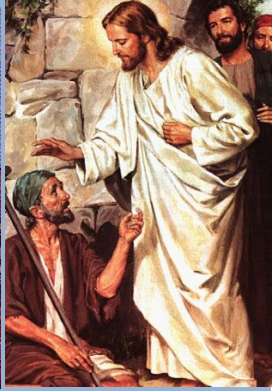
Prayer of Friends and Disciples
